2018 National Exhibition

The 2018 National Exhibition will be called '*Textile Creations*' and will take place from 16th to 29th July at the Scottish Universities Insight Institute (ex Collins Gallery), University of Strathclyde, Richmond Street, Glasgow G1 1XQ. Entries for both the selected and the unselected sections should include at least one of the crafts of weaving, spinning or dyeing. Entries for the unselected, open section should be an item of textile jewellery, in the style of Charles Rennie Mackintosh, (it is the 150th anniversary of his birth), and be not more than 12cm across and mounted on black card 12cm square.

Further details and timing will be sent to Guilds in September 2017. Submission to the selected section will be by photograph, supported by a 'feelie piece' to assist selectors and to go with the final display. It is expected that the deadline for submission will be late April 2018.
