AGWSD Conference 2018: "Then and Now" and AGM

The conference is taking place from Friday 11 to Sunday 13 May 2018 at the Kents Hill Park Training and Conference Centre, Milton Keynes, and is on the theme of "Then and Now". There are five expert speakers who will be looking at the origins of craft and artisan production in Britain, tracing forwards from the Bronze Age through revivals to the present day.

The Association AGM will be held on the afternoon of Saturday 12 May, and in the evening there will be a conference dinner followed by a short film and talk from Alain Rouveure about his work in Nepal with the carpet weavers who produce his Tibetan rugs.

Anyone attending the AGM but not the conference, such as AGM delegates, need to register and pay the fee for lunch.
